## Community Benefit Report

October 1, 2021 - September 30, 2022

### **Training**

In FY22, we trained over 400 individuals through sexual health curricula trainings, professional development workshops, webinars, and conference presentations. These groups included ADPH, DHR, ALSDE, UAB, YouthServe, AIDS Alabama, and our inaugural Girls at the Center Youth Advisory Council.



### Resources

In FY22, we developed and distributed resources to 1,900 individuals at the Birmingham Women's March, the DHR conference, the Alabama Association of School Nurses conference, the Alabama Association of School Boards conference, the Children's Policy Council conference, the ReFOCUS conference, and the HOSA conference. We also continued to provide resources on our website, social media, and monthly newsletter.

## Advocacy

With the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization (JWHO) decision to overturn Roe v. Wade, we have been strengthening the fight for comprehensive, inclusive sexual health education to prevent unplanned teen pregnancies and allow people as much bodily autonomy as possible under this current political climate.



## **Partnerships**

In FY22, we had the opportunity to partner with Department of Human Resources, Alabama Department of Public Health Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Branch, AIDS Alabama, University of Alabama Birmingham, Alabama Association of School Nurses, FOCUS, YouthServe, Burdock Book Collective, The Knights and Orchids Society and others. These partnerships allow more young people to have access to evidence-informed sexual health education.
