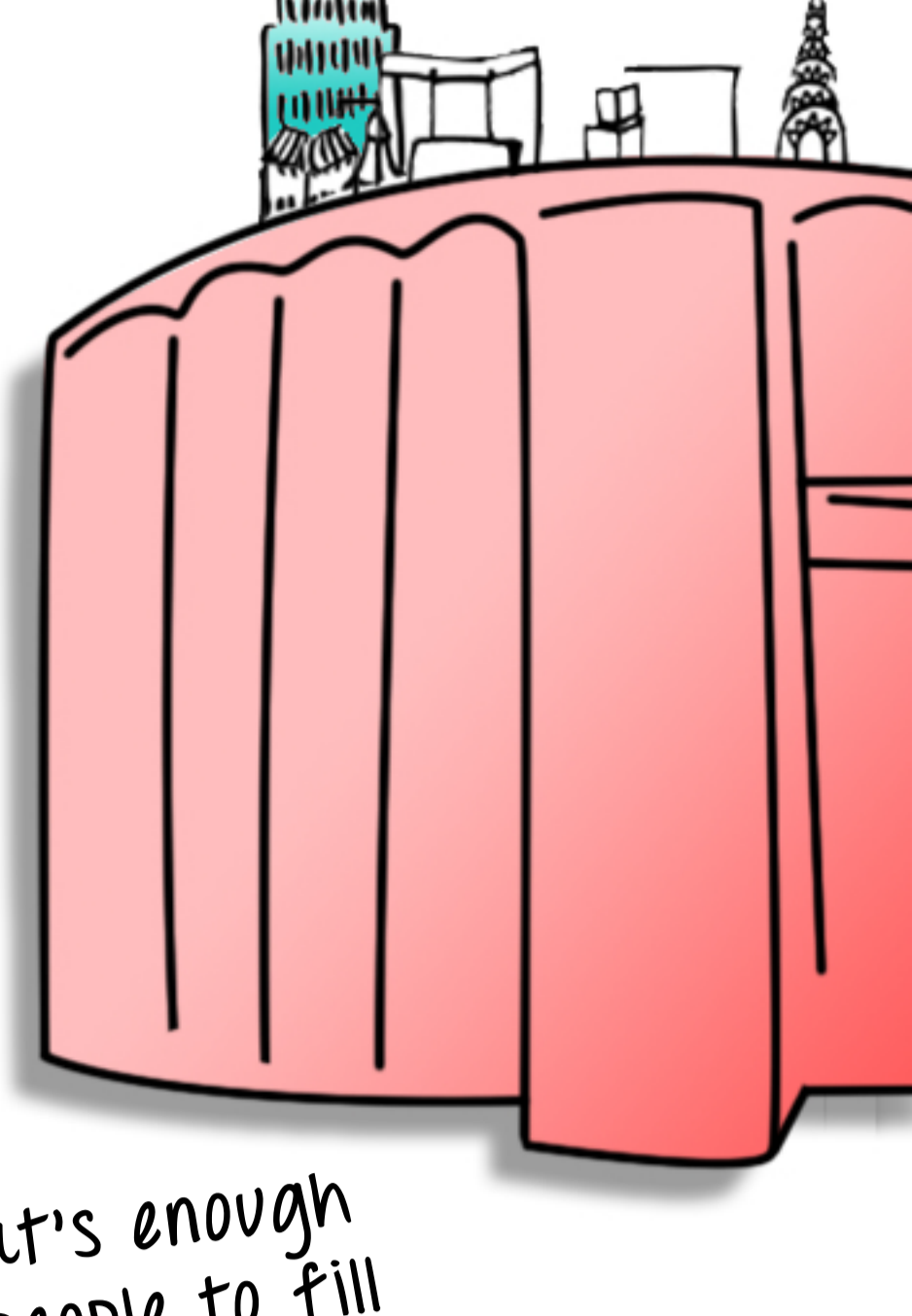

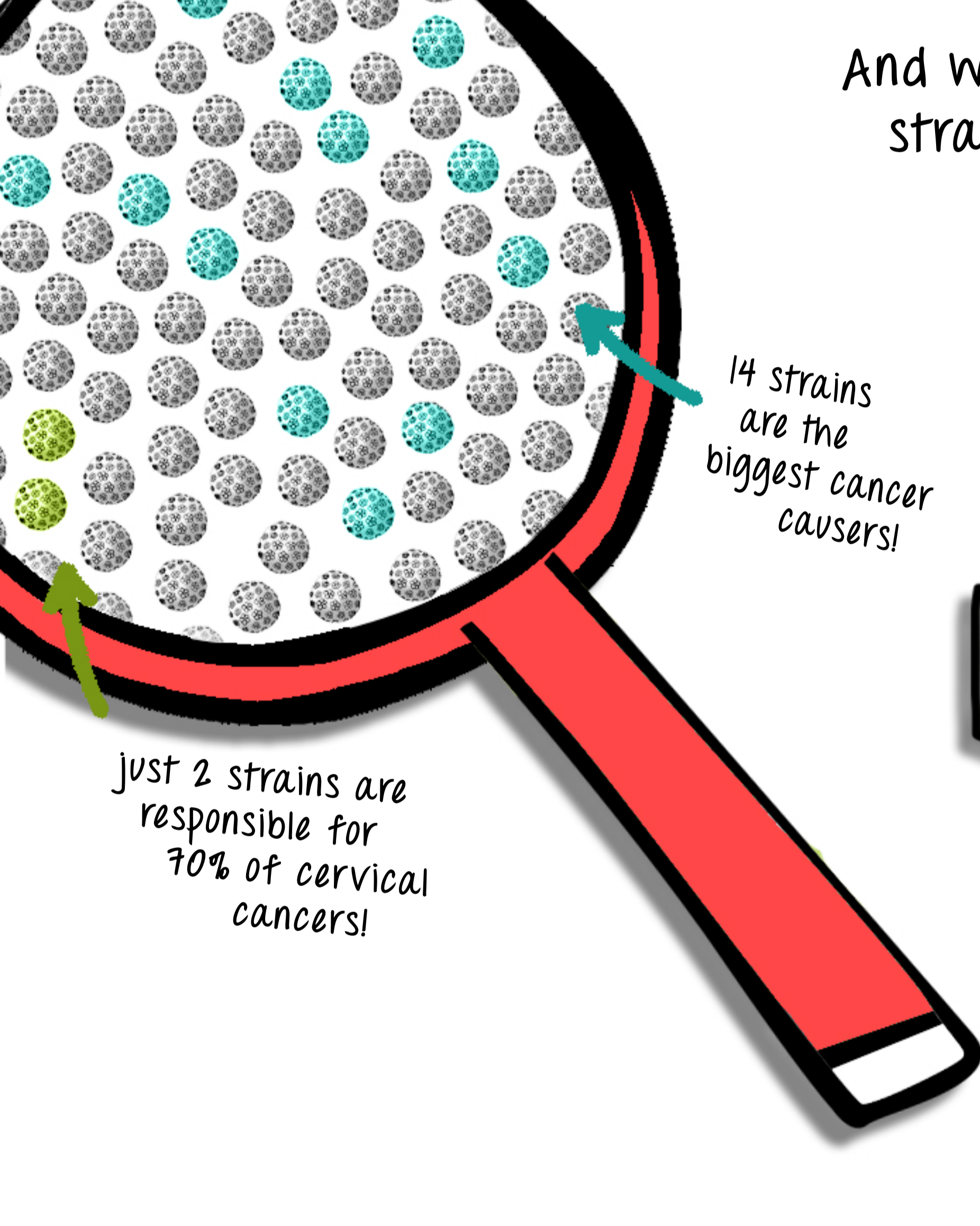
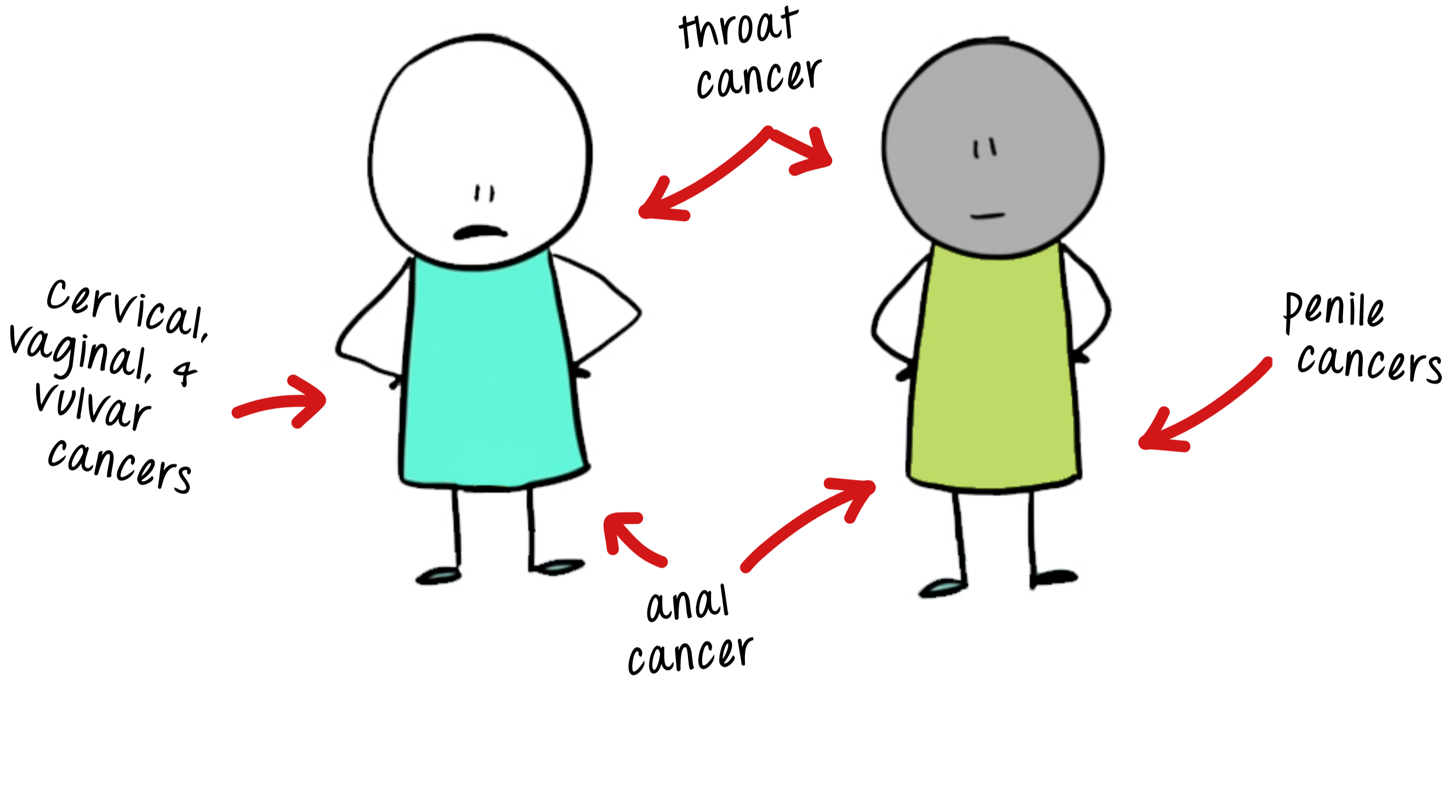

HPV can cause many types of cancer...



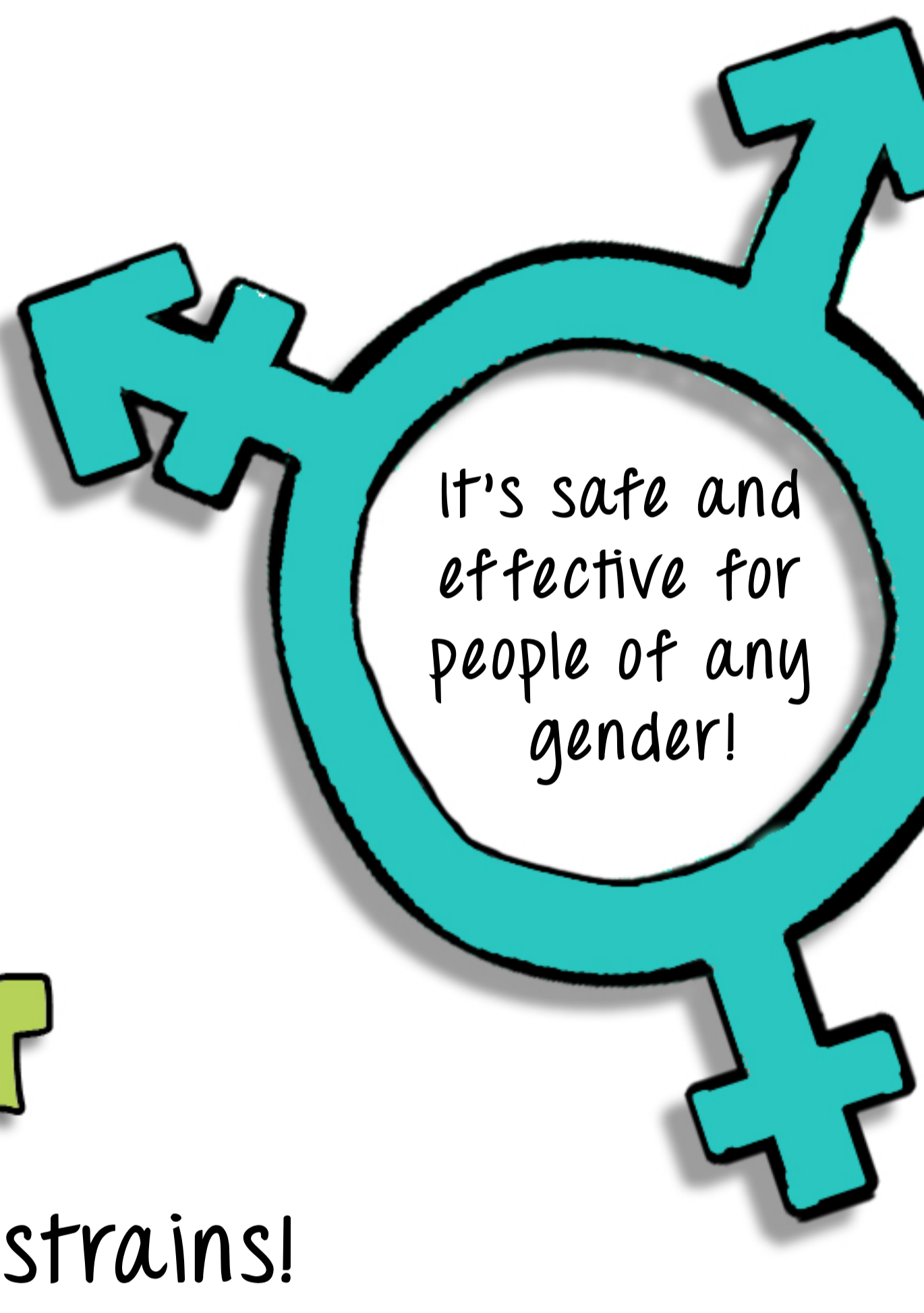
And while there are a lot of strains of HPV, a few are particularly notorious

14 strains are the biggest cancer causers!

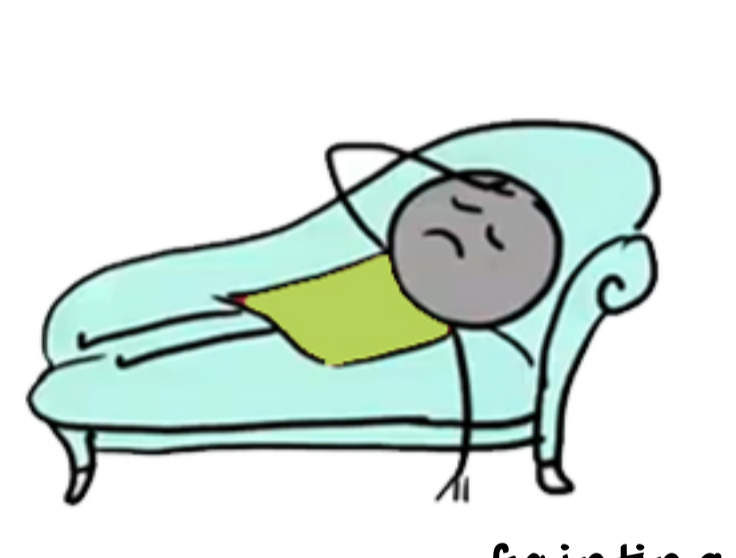

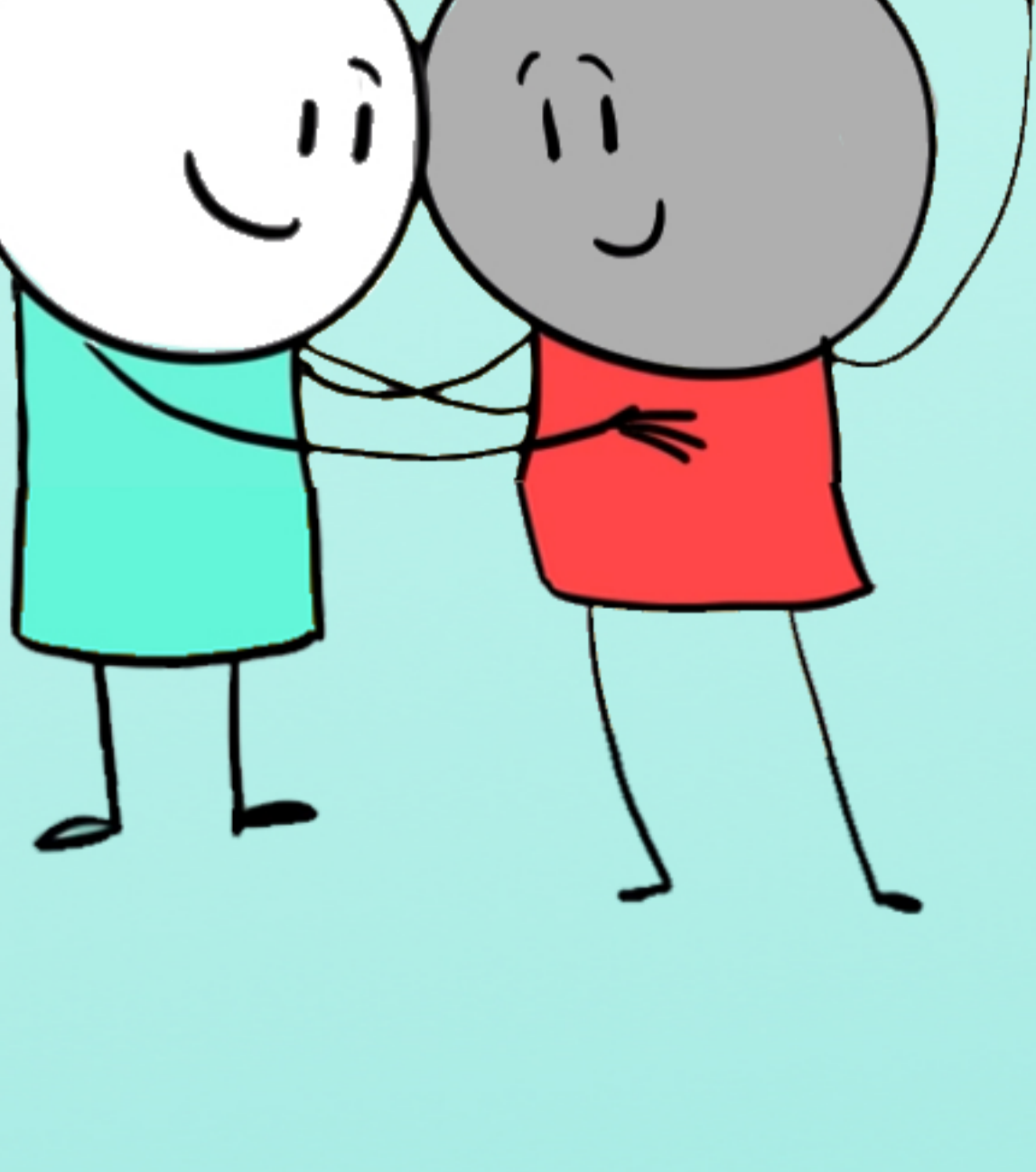
THE MOST HARMFUL strains!
